

Village of Minong – 2025 Village Board Year-in-Review

January

The year began with a strong focus on major infrastructure planning, particularly the Well House Improvement Project. The Board reviewed funding options, approved campground project payments, authorized Village Hall HVAC replacements, addressed transfer station operations, and initiated hiring for a Clerk-Treasurer Assistant.

February

February meetings focused on utilities, public works, and financial planning. Actions included disposal of old asbestos sewer pipes, emergency lift station repairs, planning for water and sewer rate studies, and continued review of utility deduct meter policies.

March

March was a highly active month with multiple meetings and a public hearing. The Board held a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) public hearing, authorized matching funds, approved the 2025 summer road plan, awarded a timber harvesting contract, adopted employee handbook updates, and hired a new Clerk-Treasurer Assistant.

April

April discussions addressed transportation, public safety, and community events. The Board updated truck route designations, approved road repairs, took enforcement action on heavy truck permit violations, certified spring election results, and advanced Village Office security improvements.

May

May included the Annual Organizational Meeting, committee appointments, and continued planning for campground operations and the Well House project.

June – August

Summer months focused on road construction, campground operations, support of community events including Minong Summer Days, and continued oversight of utilities and public safety.

September – October

Fall meetings emphasized budget monitoring, personnel matters, capital project oversight, and preparation for winter operations.

November

November focused on financial oversight, budget amendments, tax levy planning, and year-end preparation.

December

The year concluded with final financial reviews, winter operations oversight, and planning items set for early 2026.

Looking Ahead

The Village Board closed 2025 with major infrastructure projects underway, continued financial planning for utilities, and a commitment to fiscal responsibility, and long-term community investment.
